#### For the benefit of

- Could you carry these books for me?
- I will do that for you.
- Yogurt is good for your digestion.

#### Motive / Reason - with noun

- I came to New York for a new job.
- Let's go out for a drink.
- I bought this for my house.

#### Indicates direction, movement

- I will give this book to you.
- I will go to work.
- I will talk to her.

#### Motive/Reason - with verb

- I came to New York to work.
- I came here to see you.
- I study to improve my English.

#### Purpose, use of something

- This brush is for painting.
- This place is for exhibitions and shows.
- I put a note on the door for privacy.

#### Used to indicate a limit

- The snow was piled up to the roof.
- Customers can order up to three items.
- You can bring up to two guests to the event.

#### **Used to indicate a duration**

- We've lived here for 2 years.
- I worked there for 5 years.
- It's very cold for February.

#### Time

- It's 5 to 13hs.
- I work nine to six, Monday to Friday.
- It is now 10 to five. (In other words, it is 4:50.)

I made an appointment for May 3<sup>rd</sup>.

#### **Compare some sentences:**

- I wrote a letter <u>for</u> Pat. ('Pat' benefits. Someone else did the work.)
- I wrote a letter to Pat. (The 'letter' moves in the direction of 'Pat'.)
- I brought a chair for Sam. ('Sam' benefits from it.)
- I brought a chair to the table. (The chair moves in the direction towards the table.)
- I made a quick phone call for my mom." (My mom wasn't able to make the call so I made the call for her.)
- I made a quick phone call to my mom. (I called with the intention of speaking with my mom.)
