No article, "a" or "the".

When we are talking about **things** or **people in general**, we do not use "the" or "a".

No article

Most children like sweets.

Formal education in England begins when **children** reach the age of five.

Basketball is more popular in China than **football**.

We do not use "the" or "a" with names of people, in the same way, we normally don't use "the" or "a" with names of places. For example:

Names of people	Tom, (not 'the Tom'), André, Philip.
Countries	France (not 'the France'), Japan, Switzerland.
States and regions	Texas (not 'the Texas'), Central Europe.
Cities	Cairo, (not 'the Cairo'), Rio de Janeiro, Belo Horizonte.
Continents	Africa (not 'the Africa'), Europe, South America

definite article "The"
