



Either vs. Neither

Either

Used to offer a choice between two possibilities.

- Either Mike or Lisa will be there.
- Either you leave me alone or I will call the police.
- We should bring either coffee or tea.
- You can either help us or go to your room.







Neither



- Neither Mike nor Lisa will be there.
- He speaks neither English nor French.
- We brought neither coffee nor tea.
- I will neither help you nor go to my room.
- **C** Neither and either are used to show agreement with negative sentences.

Person A	Person B	Person B
	NEITHER	EITHER
I am not hungry.	Neither am I.	= I'm not hungry either .
I' m not going to quit.	Neither am I.	= I'm not going to quit either .
They don't speak French.	Neither do I.	= I don't speak French either .
Mary didn't go to the party.	Neither did I.	= I didn't go either .
He won't stop talking.	Neither will you.	= You won't stop either .
You haven't finished your meal.	Neither have you.	= You haven't finished either .

TOO + NOT = EITHER

WRONG \rightarrow I'm not hungry **too** (Too is for positive statements)

CORRECT → I'm <u>not</u> hungry <u>either.</u>
